

THE NDE AND HEALING: Personal and Cross Cultural Journeys

JOYCE HAWKES, PhD

Many NDErs discover a new and intense sense of "mission" after they recover from the physical trauma that precipitated their NDE. A significant number of these people report healing in themselves and can facilitate healing states for others.

In the workshop, Dr. Hawkes will share her understanding of healing practices in our culture and those of other cultures. During the last six years, Joyce has studied and worked with healers in India, the Philippines and Bali as well as maintaining a private healing practice in pastoral counseling in Seattle.

$\underline{2}$ JUNG, CAMPBELL AND THE NDE : The Hero's Journey

BONNIE LONG

Drawing on the work of C.G. Jung and Joseph Campbell, here is a fascinating look at the NDE in the context of the classic Hero's Journey. Miss Long will also blend in historical material, such as the search for the Castle of the Grail, the Shamanic Initiation, as well as imagery from a worldwide spiritual and cultural matrix. Be prepared for a refreshing new look at the NDE.

Bonnie Long is a NDEr, writer, Egyptologist, Anthropologist, art and film bounds, and member of the C.G. Jung Society of Seattle.

3 THE NEAR DEATH EXPERIENCE AND THE ADDICTIVE PERSONALITY: Are they interactive?

DAVID W. JOHNSON

Consider the following: An NDE is a spiritual experience usually triggered by a physical trauma. An active addiction is a physical trauma usually resolved by a spiritual experience.

We will explore the following questions: Does coming back increase the proclivity toward substance abuse? (There may be some evidence of this.) How does an NDE affect the addictive personality who is practicing in its addiction? Does the NDE increase or interfere with the willingness of an addict to accept the spirituality of 12-step program? Is a recovering addict in a unique position to apply the spiritual experience of an NDE to his/her daily life? Since there are neither research nor abstract data available in this field we will spend a part of the time listening to brief expositions of personal experiences by recovering alcoholics and/or addicts in this area of interest.

David W. Johnson is a retired businessman who had an NDE 13 years ago as the result of a heart attack. He was also a practicing alcoholic who found it more difficult to manage his addiction after the NDE. He is now in his 11th year of continuous sobriety through active participation in a 12 step program.

4 THE CHRISTIAN AND THE NDE

NANCY EVANS BUSH, MA

Both explicitly and by suggestion, Old and New Testament narratives point to NDE - like experiences as formative of Christian symbol and belief. Taking a fateful but non-literal approach to the Biblical stories the workshop will begin with a quick exploration of some of these accounts and suggest how they may relate to the spiritual life of the modern non-fundamentalist Christian.

5 BEDSIDE AND BEYOND: Helping the Near Death Experiencer Cope KIMBERLY CLARK SHARP, MSW

With the advent of advanced medical technology, more people are not only resuscitated from cardiac and respiratory arrest, but are remembering events which occurred during the death experience. Because these events have extraordinary qualities - such as hovering over the physical body - and are alien to traditional Western culture, survivors find it difficult and often painful to assimilate a process which cannot be readily explained or accepted by others.

Attendees at this workshop will learn psychophysiological theories which may account for the occurrence of a NDE, clinical interventions to be used during and after cardiac resuscitation, interviewing techniques, and counseling approaches for the long term NDE survivor.

6 LIVING WITH THE NDEr: A Support Group for Family and Friends of Near Death Experiencers.*

JOYCE GRISWOLD, Spouse of Multiple NDEr

A NDEr's family, friends and associates do not choose to be involved - involvement is thrust upon them ready, willing or otherwise and they must deal with the experience - usually entirely unsupported. Unfortunately the result is generally destructive to long established relationships. This group will share common experience, mitigate stress, discuss strategies for relationship survival and develop support organization.

CONFERENCE SPEAKERS

KENNETH RING, PhD.

Ken's keynote address, AMAZING GRACE: The NDE as a Compensatory Gift, will emphasize the providential way near-death experiences can enter into a person's life - - AMAZING GRACE - and bring about an unexpected and life-changing healing; and in a more general sense, the healing gifts conferred by the NDE. Ring will also be proposing a daring interpretation of survey findings regarding the high incidence of disturbed childhoods - including physical mistreatment, sexual abuse and neglect. It turns out these people were also more likely than others to recall psychic episodes from their childhood.

Professor of Psychology at the University of Connecticut, Ken Ring is a co-founder of IANDS. He is the author of two books on the near-death experience, LIFE AT DEATH and HEADING TOWARD OMEGA, and of the forthcoming book, THE OMEGA PROJECT (1992).

NANCY EVANS BUSH, MA

Is there a "hell" as well as "heaven" in some NDE's? Most of the near-death experiences reported in the past 20 years have been radiant and light -filled. The rarely-told accounts of dark and terrifying experiences have been discounted by most contemporary writers and remain little known. Here are some of those dark experiences, with thoughts on how we might approach understanding them in a new perspective.

With a professional background in education and non-profit administration, Nancy was Executive Director of IANDS at the University of Connecticut and is now its Vice President. Author of the first descriptive study of the NDE in children, she has published on nursing, education, and pastoral ministry and is a contributor to the Abingdon Dictionary of Pastoral Counseling. She is a graduate of the State University of New York (Albany) and holds a Masters Degree in Pastoral Ministry and Spirituality from St. Joseph College, Connecticut.

in the Japanese Garden

MELVIN MORSE, MD

Melvin Morse, MD is a Pediatrician with a busy private practice in Renton, Washington. He has studied the near-death experiences of children for nine years and has interviewed hundreds of children. His research has been published in the AMA's Pediatric Journal and he has recently published a best selling book - CLOSER TO THE LIGHT.

This presentation will summarize nine years of research on neardeath experiences in children. The emphasis will be on what we can learn to enrich our own lives from the insights that children gain from their near-death experiences. Childhood and adult NDEs have distinct differences that give us invaluable insights into the nature of the near-death experience. A brief overview of the scientific research on near-death experiences will be presented. New research on the long term effects of childhood near-death experiences currently being done at the University of Washington will close the lecture.

KIMBERLY CLARK SHARP, MSW

In her lecture Kimberly will discuss all known elements of the neardeath experience: remote viewing of one's body, meeting deceased loved ones, encountering a brilliant loving light, as well as reasons persons return to life. She will also share her own near-death experience and her observations based on her counseling work with hundreds of other near-death experiencers.

Kimberly had a near-death experience in 1970 and is one of the b known authorities in the country on the subject of Near-Death Experiences. Leader of the Seattle Chapter of IANDS for nine years, Pacific Northwest magazine named her one of the forty most influential persons under the age of 40 in the Pacific Northwest. Her credentials include: Director Social Work for the Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Center; Clinical Assistant Professor, School of Social Work, University of Washington; and Advisory Board Member and Seattle Coordinator for IANDS.
